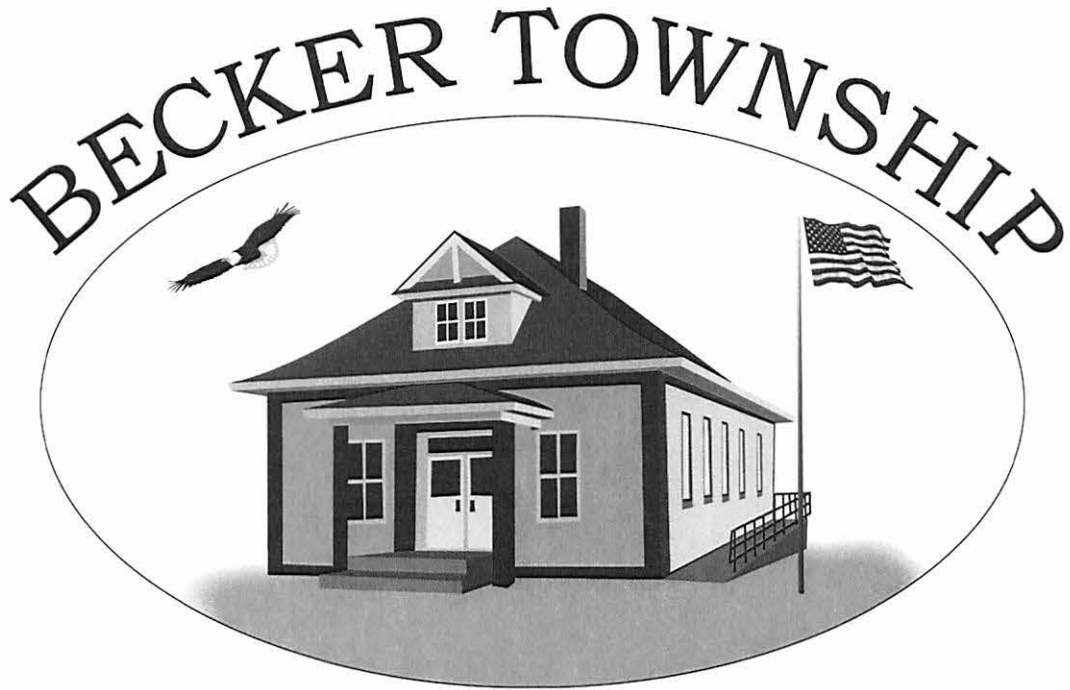

<p>The Becker Library staff and materials are funded by the Great River Regional Library System, but the availability, maintenance and upkeep of space, utility costs, cleaning supplies and customer service support is reliant upon the city-run Becker Community Center (BCC) budget.</p> <p>Estimated costs associated with providing clean, well-maintained, usable space for the library is estimated to be at or above \$60,000/year. Additional repair costs can drive this number even higher, such as roof repairs, HVAC updates and electrical work.</p> <p>The BCC would appreciate your continued support to provide clean, well-maintained, and usable space for the library to serve the many customers it serves each month.</p>	<p>The City of Becker appreciates the support the Township has provided for youth sports in the past. As we continue to grow at the Becker Athletic Complex (BAC), and throughout the city, our financial demands grow with it. This year we are looking to add additions to the BAC that will provide enhanced safety for participants and attendees, including extending fences and potentially adding safety netting.</p> <p>Listed below is a breakdown of the average annual usage at the BAC, as well as information regarding other recreational facilities in the city: Football- 160-180 kids – 60% city/40% township Soccer- 350-400 participants – 60% city/40% township Baseball- 240-280 participants – 42% township/35% city/23% other Lacrosse- More than 120 Softball- 160+ (Youth Sports participant #'s and information provided by association reps and/or coaches or facility scheduling staff)</p> <p>Additionally, we have Adult Baseball and Softball played at the BAC- The breakdown here is actually closer to 75% township/25% city. I also wanted to note that recreation programming and facility use happens in many other locations throughout the city, with more than \$150,000 in playground & turf establishment updates that have been added in the past three years. The city also operates a professional disc golf course, and numerous walking, hiking & horse trails, and scenic picnic sites throughout the 160+ acre well-maintained park system. We also have our outdoor skating at Kolbinger Park that welcomes approximately 3000 visitors to the rink from December through the first week in March annually. Kolbinger also hosts our skate park for youth that sees 150+ participants per week from May-October.</p> <p>This year the City of Becker has allocated \$440,000 to support the Becker Community Center. We also bring in more than \$476,000 in revenue for the BCC. The city has also allocated \$50,000 in capital funds for park development and improvements, as well as an additional \$134,000+ in general fund expenditures.</p> <p>We respectfully ask for your support once again to provide quality recreational opportunities for the youth of Becker- City and Township.</p>	<p>Each summer the City of Becker coordinates the Becker Freedom Days. We are happy to hold this great event each year "downtown" by the Town Hall. I feel this location really brings out an old-fashioned small town feel to our event that makes it special. The grand day event, this year scheduled for Saturday, June 15th, typically has several thousand spectators and participants who enjoy the parade, 5K run, carnival, food, games, entertainment and more.</p> <p>The festivities are capped off each year by a spectacular fireworks display. I present to the board tonight a request for the township to join hands with the city to co-sponsor the fireworks. The fireworks show costs approximately \$7000-\$7500 each year for the professional fireworks pyrotechnics team, as well as police and fire support locally. Incidentally, the Freedom Days Committee does solicit and garner \$6000-\$8000 in sponsorship each year, as well as coordinating more than 100 volunteers.</p> <p>The Freedom Days Committee respectfully asks for your support to continue this tradition and celebration of our country's freedom.</p>

2012 ANNUAL BECKER TOWNSHIP MEETING
MARCH 13, 2012

The Annual Town Meeting, held in the Town of Becker in the County of Sherburne and State of Minnesota, at Becker Township Hall on the 13th day of March 2012, was called to order by Clerk Judy Shermak. Mark Limpert moved second Duane Gates to nominate Brad Wilkening as Moderator. Motion carried. There were no other nominations. Duane Gates moved second Kyle Johnson to cease nominations. Motion carried. Brad Wilkening was elected as Moderator.

Duane Gates moved, second Kris Hammer to dispense with reading of minutes of the 2011 Annual Meeting and approve as distributed. Motion carried. The treasurer's report was given by Tanya Danielson, Treasurer. The clerk and treasurer 2011 reports and records were audited by the Town Board at the Board of Audit Meeting on February 27, 2012. Gary Hammer gave a summary of the bond debt paid and reissuing of bonds for the Fire Hall. Kris Hammer moved, second Joyce Lambert, to approve as distributed. Motion carried.

Euretta Sorenson, Chief Nursing Officer, and Bob Dawson-Becker Township Representative, gave an update on the New River Medical Center and handed out the 2011 annual report to residents in attendance. They gave an overview of services available, new services at the hospital and nursing home. The Hospital's legal status is being changed to a non-profit 501c3 from a government entity in 2012. She discussed changes in Board members that will be made.

Brad Wilkening, Chairman of the Becker Township Planning Commission, and Kelli Neu, Zoning Administrator, gave an update of the Planning Commission, Joint Planning Board, and update of the Comprehensive Plan, zoning, ordinances, and building permits. There were 140 building permits pulled in 2011, with 15 being new housing units. When Land Use Permits are required from Sherburne County their fee is deducted from the Township fee. Stan Lumley asked if there is a report available in writing and whether the Township is making a profit from permits. Kelli explained that according to state law a profit cannot be made, but all fees associated with permitting should break even. A spreadsheet with all expenditures was done for 2011 and the result was just breaking even. \$68,875.46 was collected in fees of which 30% is disbursed to West Metro for inspections.

Mark Limpert, Supervisor, gave a road report for the township. Expenditures in 2011 were \$21,659-Sealcoating, \$170,855-Resurfacing, and \$782-Cul-de-sac overlay. For preventative maintenance costs were \$184,457-Crackfilling, \$64,084-Snow plowing, salt and sand, \$60,408-Other. Total cost was \$502,245. Scheduled projects and estimates for 2012 are Reclaim 143rd Ave.-\$33,335, Sealcoating-\$208,125, and Striping-\$650. Stan Lumley questioned salt and sand use as he felt the roads were not properly maintained and needed more. Gary Hammer stated the Board is looking into using a higher concentration of salt with the sand. Louis Weed asked the amount being used and Hammer said it is currently 5% salt. Hammer stated citizens are welcome to call board members with problem roads.

Old Business:

Louis Weed asked about special interest groups and last year's final funding made by the Board. The total amount distributed last year was \$14,100.

Stan Lumley stated residents should be more responsible for their dogs and keeping them under control.

New Business:

- Danish Cemetery Association - \$700. Funds would be used for spring clean up, purchase trees, and install benches. Duane Gates moved second Stan Lumley to approve. Motion carried.
- Becker Cemetery Association - \$800. Duane Gates moved second Duane Peterson to approve. Motion carried.
- Friends of the Becker Library - \$450. Funds to be used for desk project. Duane Gates moved second Stan Lumley to approve. Motion carried.
- Becker Parks & Recreation, Becker Library, & Becker Freedom Days - \$9,000. Funds to be used for Youth & Adult Sports & Recreation Activities, Library upkeep, Freedom Days Fireworks. Duane Gates moved second Stan Lumley to approve. Motion carried.
- 2012 Becker All Night Chemical Free Graduation Party – \$750. Duane Gates moved second Stan Lumley to approve. Motion carried.
- Becker Safety Camp - \$750. Funds to be used for First Aid Kits. Duane Gates moved second Stan Lumley to approve. Motion carried.
- Monticello Community Education - \$800. Funds to be used for Becker Township residents in Monticello School District. Stan Lumley moved second Duane Gates to approve. Motion carried.
- Snake River Cemetery - \$550. Funds to be used for adding two names on the Veterans Memorial Stone and upkeep of cemetery. Duane Gates moved second Stan Lumley to approve. Motion carried.

Township Fund (Tax) Allocations for Fiscal Year 2013:

- General Revenue Fund – Duane Gates moved second Stan Lumley to allocate \$40,000.00, plus \$13,800.00 for above requests. Total amount of \$53,800.00. Motion carried.
- Fire Fund – Stan Lumley moved second Louis Weed to decrease allocation from \$220,000 to \$150,000.00 as per Town Board recommendation. Motion carried.
- Road and Bridge Fund – Duane Gates moved second Stan Lumley, to increase allocation from \$550,000 to \$600,000 as per Town Board recommendation. Motion carried.
- Town Hall Fund – Louis Weed moved second Joyce Lambert to allocate \$15,000 as per Town Board recommendation. Motion carried.
- New Fire Hall Building Fund – Duane Gates moved second Louis Weed to decrease allocation from \$45,000 to \$40,000 for new Fire Hall Building. This is the approximate amount of the township's bond payment. Motion carried.

TOWNSHIP ROAD REPORT, 2013 ANNUAL MEETING

General:

The Town of Becker maintains 61.65 miles of township road of which 49.70 miles are blacktopped. Gravel surfaced roads amount to 11.95 miles. A township-wide road review is conducted annually by the Town Board, its Contractors and Engineer. Road conditions are assessed at these reviews. Roadway maintenance and rehabilitation projects are prioritized and estimated construction costs prepared. Upon consideration by the Board, the annual road and bridge fund budget is adopted.

Crack Sealing:

In the interest of protecting its investment in roadway structures, the Town maintains an annual crack sealing program on an as-needed basis.

Seal Coating:

The Town spent \$200,853.46 for seal coat applications in 2012. The work was performed under a contract administered by the County Highway Department. A seal coat contract for town roads for the 2013 construction season is presently being bid by the County. The estimated cost is \$71,900.00.

Striping:

Approximately \$650.00 was spent on roadway striping in 2012. The projected cost for striping in 2013 is \$1,480.00.

Sign Program:

In accordance to Federal Rule CFR Part 655, the Township has undertaken a traffic signage maintenance program in order to comply with federal location and retroreflectivity requirements. A sign inventory is currently being performed. The preliminary estimate of the annual cost for the township-wide sign program is \$8,000.00.

Grading:

There were no grading projects let in 2012 nor are there any grading projects scheduled for 2013.

Gravelling:

The gravel surfaced town roads are periodically re-gravelled based on recommendations from the Township's Maintenance Contractor.

Maintenance Projects:

In 2012, the Township Contractor re-aligned a culvert on 170th Street and completed a subgrade correction on 82nd Street.

In addition, quotes were received for shoulder rehabilitation work on 67th Street, a town line road. The final value of the contact is \$17,079.30 of which \$853.97 of retainage is to be released this spring. Santiago Township funded half of the project cost.

Surfacing:

The final value for the reclamation and bituminous surfacing project let in 2012 was \$28,213.25. The project contract was administered by the County. The estimated cost for bituminous surfacing projects for the 2013 construction season is \$134,900.00.

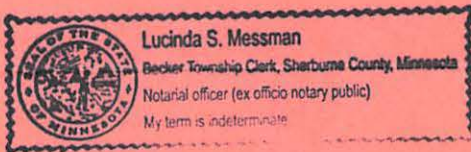

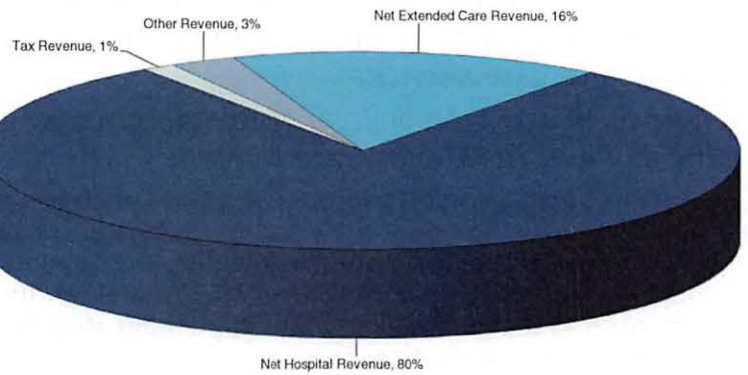

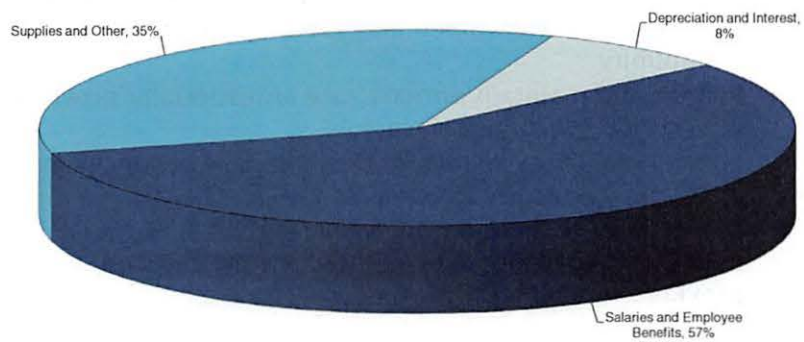
